One Saint Valentine was a Roman priest and doctor who was beheaded about 269 A.D.. He was buried in a cemetery named for him. The second was a bishop who is believed to have been beheaded in Rome about 273 A. D. The third was a

known martyr in Africa.

The customs of Saint Valentine's Day have no connection with those saints excepting their feast day. There are several different explanations for the customs of sending cards of greeting and love tokens on Saint Valentine's Day. Some of them are probably inaccurate. The most plausible is that Saint Valentine's day is a survival of a February 15 Roman Fastival.


