

John F. Kennedy, Jr., announced teday that he will be in the running for the Democratic new insticm for Senator from Massachusetts, His campaign slogan will be: " I can do more for :Massachuae tts."

President Ted Kennedy said today that Jack, former President (1960-1968), will be out of retirement and be named Secretary of State, replacing Jacqueline, who will be given the post of Secretary of Defense.

Presedental Press Secretary, Mrs. Joseph P. Kennedy, mother the President, celebrated her 85th birthday today, and said that she has no thought of retiring. She also said that recent talk about a "Kennedy Dynasty" in Washington is just Republican proganda and a lot of rubbish

When questioned on the "Meet the Press" television program last night, Secretary of the Treasury, Bobby Kennedy said that he did not think the President's nime hundred billion dollar budget was too large. But he did say that the figure of three hundred fifty billion for foreign aid would be trimmed a trifle. "After all", he said, " there is such a thing as over doing it, you know."
