

THEY'RE STILL RUNNING

Two Crossland harriers, who brought glory to their school in their senior year, have not rested on their laurels, but have gone on to win first place honors for the colleges they are now attending.

Ed Bowie, Crossland class of '66, is now attending Towson State College, and has continued to star on their track team. Most recently, he won first place in the 600-yard run in the Chesapeake Invitational Track Meet held last month in the Fifth Regiment Armory in Baltimore. Ed was competing with runners from both major college squads and independent track clubs, in the Chesapeake Track Club-sponsored meet. Crossland won the Maryland State Championship in Track in 1966, with Ed winning his event easily, helping to spark a winning team.

A 1967 graduate of Crossland, Bob Gray is now attending Brevard College in Brevard, N.C. Brevard, a small junior college, probably most noted for its outstanding Division of Fine Arts music program (it was recently accepted as a member of the National Association of Schools of Music), has now gained national track prominence too. A key figure in this rise to prominence was Bob Gray. He was the Maryland State champion in the mile run in his senior year at Crossland last year. In his first season at Brevard, Bob was undefeated, setting eight records in eleven meets.
